


Municipal Context

 Retreat Centre



- Strategically re-imagining a continued presence across
 Canada
- Undertaking a strategic assessment of all land holdings & assets








Guiding Principles

- Create a lasting legacy








With consideration of:


Engagement Summary Completed to date



Com Key Themes -



- Cochrane Heights & Sunterra are single-access communities
- Traffic congestion is a concern on 1A Hwy, 4th Avenue
- The site is home to diverse wildlife & vegetation
- The 'Big Hill' is an important part of Cochrane's identity – preserve the integrity of the Cochrane Hill
- Public access to the Cochrane Hill and mountain views are important
- Slope stability concerns along 4th Avenue
- Appreciation for early engagement opportunities
- There is a deep respect for the Franciscans in Cochrane



Big Hill Environmental Park



Minor Neighbourhood Expansion (1)



Minor Neighbourhood Expansion (2)



 infrastructure costs








Preliminary Vision Statements

A Holistic Plan to:


- Establish a thoughtfullyplaced residential neighbourhood within the 'bench lands'
